



Due to the urgency for building new accommodation blocks for our boarders at school, the directors decided to go ahead with the purchase of three plots of land only five hundred metres from our primary school in Uganda. But I can now report that we have ended up with four plots after another one became available during my last visit. We now have four adjoining plots giving us plenty of scope for a range of buildings and a play area, it is a real blessing for us and guess what – it has all been paid for! Norman came out for ten days to erect the fencing with the help of six of our former children who worked very hard in the heat and the thunder storms, it was only completed just before heading home so we are very thankful to them. Please pray that no one tries to steal the fencing or the posts although I guarantee it would be a difficult job with the amount of cement put into the holes. When we have buildings, the site will be much more secure so that is the next phase of the project. We would like to thank all those who have already given to this work and trust that more people will get excited about providing much needed accommodation for our children and help raise more funds for us. Next year we are planning to do some levelling of the land and putting in the foundations for two of the buildings. What would be great is to have at least one of the buildings finished by the end of 2026, our school motto is: **“With God all things are possible”** and we believe that.



Our school is still looking great and is being well cared for, when we have new dormitories, it will release space to provide some larger classrooms. The children are studying hard as this year's final exams approach. Primary Seven's need to pass in all subjects to move on to senior school, so it is an important time for them to do their best and use their time wisely. The teachers responsible for primary six and primary seven give tuition every evening during the week and also on Saturdays.



Of course, we cannot forget our older children who are now in senior school. Those who we are totally responsible for are in boarding schools, it is expensive but not only gives a good standard of education but also provides for their daily needs.
